FOUNDING DOCUMENT

The charity was set up by means of a constitution that was accepted by the Office of the Scottish Regulator on 9 October 2017.

CHARITABLE PURPOSES

The charitable purposes of the Association are the advancement of education and the advancement of the arts, heritage, culture or science by providing a website, information, educational resources, talks and exhibitions about the Holocaust and the refugee experience to the general public, students and school children and by learning from testimonies of Holocaust survivors and refugees from Nazi persecution who have settled in Scotland.

ACTIVITIES

The Gathering the Voices Association had another busy and successful year in 2019. In January 2019, our mobile exhibition was featured at the East Renfrewshire/Renfrewshire Holocaust Memorial Day event, following which it was installed in Paisley Abbey for one week. During that time Howard Singerman gave a number of talks at the Abbey. We took the exhibition to a large number of schools during the year and gave talks at all the schools. Another highlight came at the end of the year when the exhibition was displayed at St Ninian's High School, East Renfrewshire for three weeks. Howard Singerman and Steven Anson gave talks to all 1800 of the school's pupils, trained a number of the students to guide their fellow pupils round the exhibition and held a Holocaust Information evening attended by family and friends of pupils.

Angela Shapiro conducted a seminar for History students and staff at Glasgow Caledonian University. In addition, we gave talks to a number of other organisations such as church and social groups. Steven Anson featured as one of the living books at the Living Library Scottish Storytelling Festival in Edinburgh, telling his father's story.

There have been no changes in the trustees during the year.

TRUSTEES REMUNERATION AND EXPENSES

The Trustees received reimbursement of expenses of £133 during the year (2018: £571).

RESERVES

All of the Trust funds are unrestricted general funds and are used by the Trustees to further the work being carried out in accordance with the above charitable purposes.

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2019 which are set out on pages 3 and 4.
