THE REASON WE STARTED IT WAS BECAUSE WE KNEW THE SURVIVORS OF THE HOLOCAUST WERE GETTING OLDER, AND WE WANTED TO BE SURE THEIR STORIES WERE RECORDED AND REMEMBERED.



IN PARTICULAR WE WANTED TO HIGHLIGHT THE WARMTH AND WELCOME THAT THEY RECEIVED IN SCOTLAND WHEN THEY SETTLED HERE AND THE CONTRIBUTION THEY THEN MADE TO SCOTTISH LIFE.



WE WANTED TO CHALLENGE NEGATIVE STORIES ABOUT REFUGEES, TO HELP NEW SCOTS FEEL AT HOME.



AND WE WANTED ALL THOSE STORIES OUT THERE, FREELY AVAILABLE. NO ONE SHOULD HAVE TO PAY TO ACCESS TESTIMONY.

FOR MANY YEARS, WE HAD VOLUNTEERED WITH THE ASSOCIATION OF JEWISH REFUGEES, HELPING OUT AT THEIR AFTERNOON TEAS.



PEOPLE WOULD CHAT, AND TELL THEIR STORIES. OVER THE YEARS A BOND OF TRUST DEVELOPED. THAT'S WHY THEY GAVE US THEIR TESTIMONY.

WE BORROWED RECORDERS FROM GCU AND STARTED TO GET ORGANISED. IT TOOK A WHILE FOR PEOPLE TO GET INVOLVED...

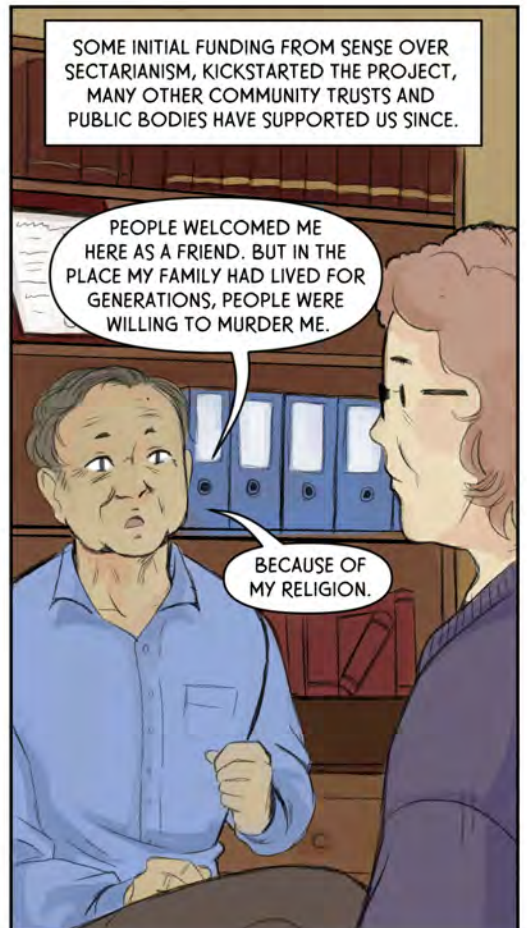


I RECORDED MY TESTIMONY.

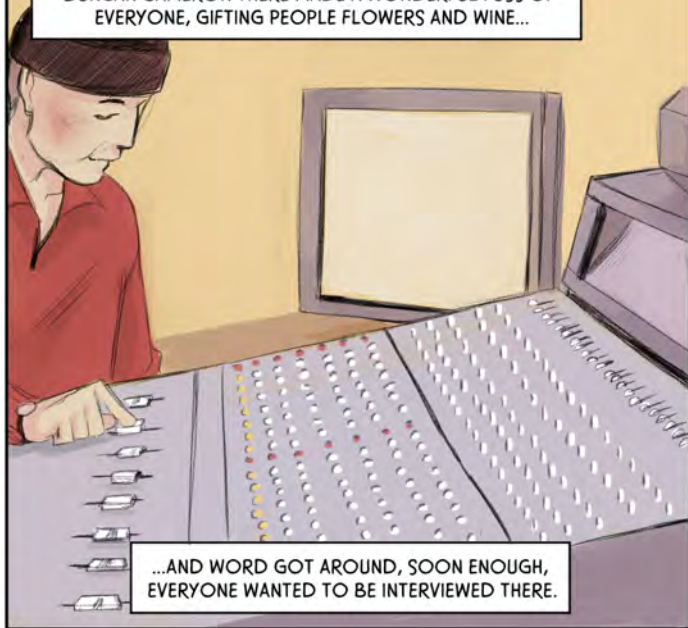
BECAUSE OF MY RELIGION.

WE TRAVELLED AROUND, POLITELY EATING A LOT OF CAKE...



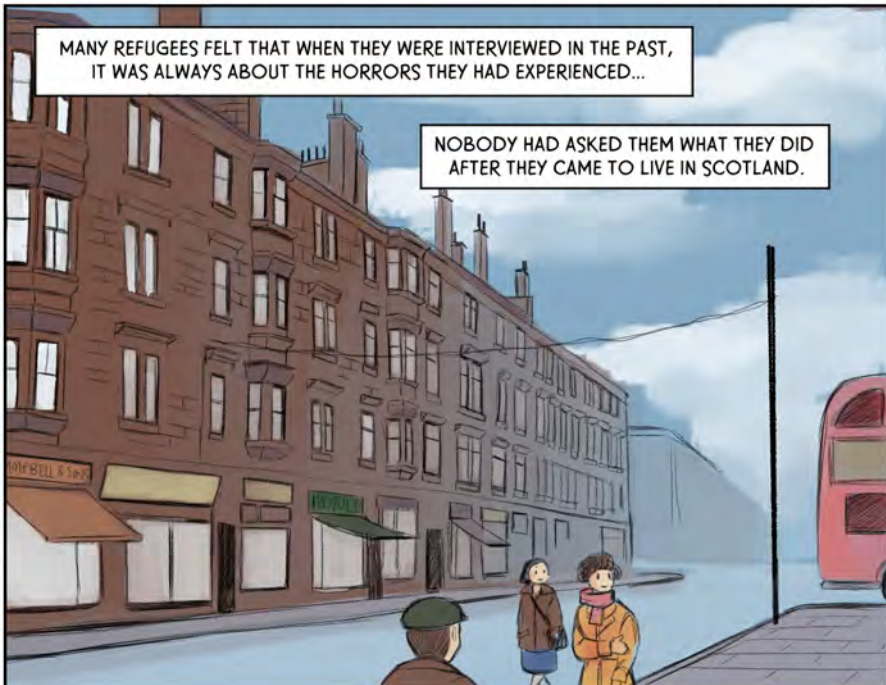

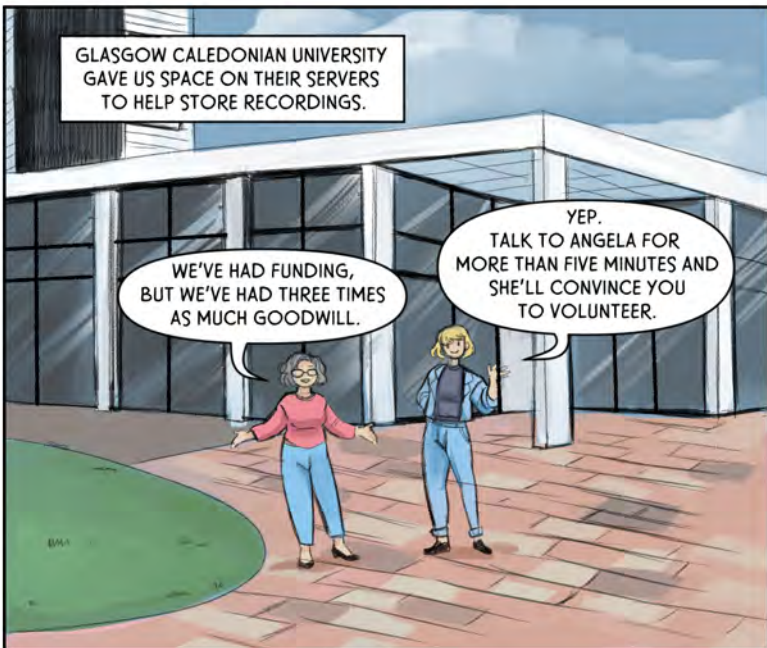
SOMEHOW NOW WE HAVE OUR OWN YOUTUBE CHANNEL, A WEBSITE, PODCASTS...

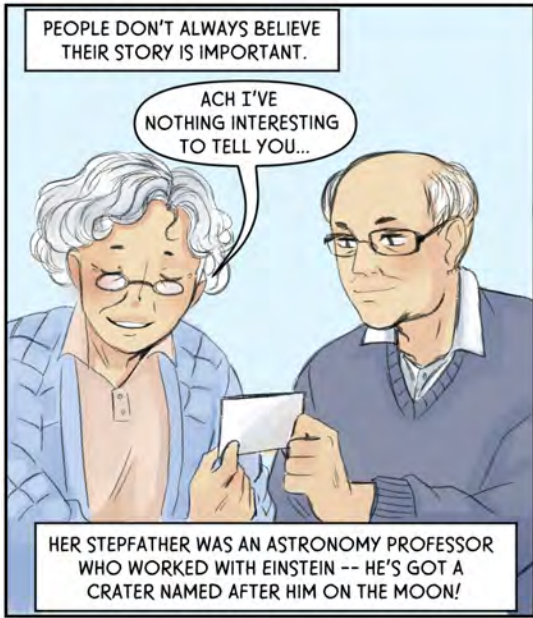


GLASGOW CALEDONIAN UNIVERSITY GAVE US SPACE ON THEIR SERVERS TO HELP STORE RECORDINGS.

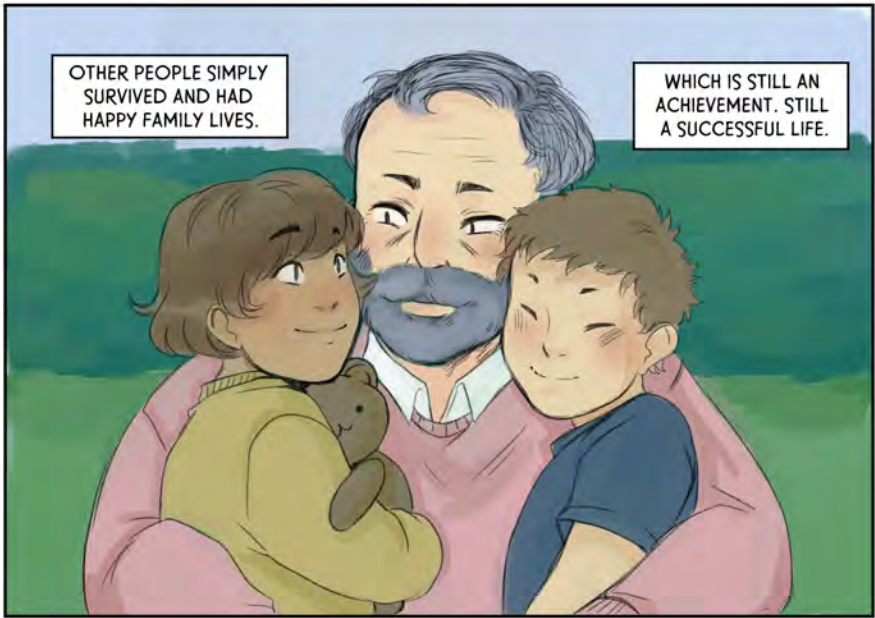




PEOPLE DON'T ALWAYS BELIEVE THEIR STORY IS IMPORTANT.

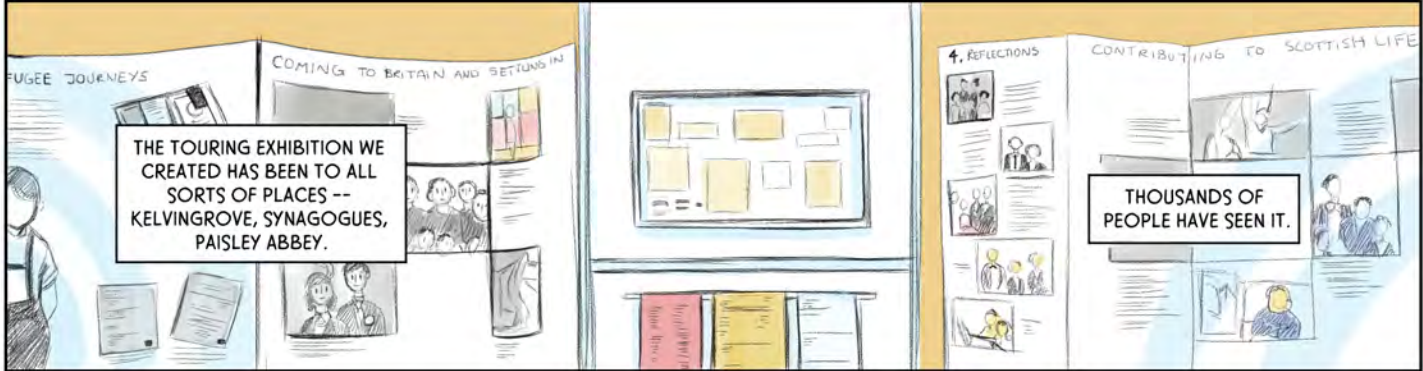
OTHER PEOPLE SIMPLY SURVIVED AND HAD HAPPY FAMILY LIVES.

WHICH IS STILL AN ACHIEVEMENT. STILL A SUCCESSFUL LIFE.



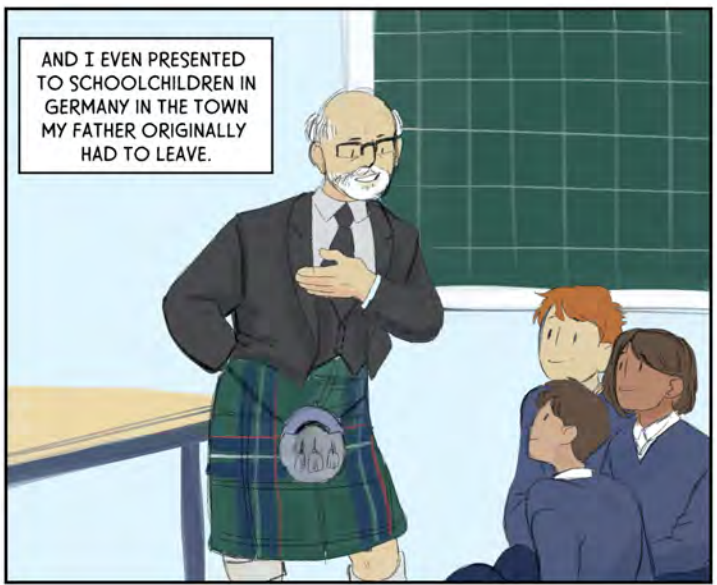
AND OF COURSE SOME PEOPLE NEVER REALLY GOT OVER WHAT HAPPENED.

THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE HAVE SEEN IT.



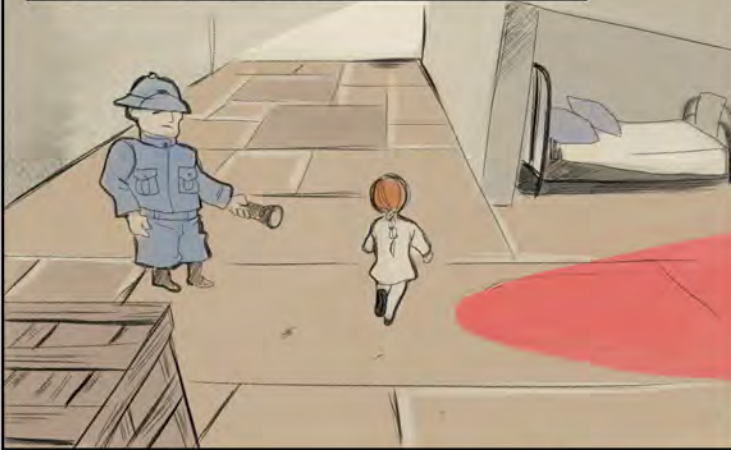

WE'RE A SMALL GROUP OF VOLUNTEERS, BUT WE'VE BEEN ABLE TO DO SO MUCH. OUR APPROACH IS "LET'S JUST HAVE A GO AND SEE WHAT HAPPENS"

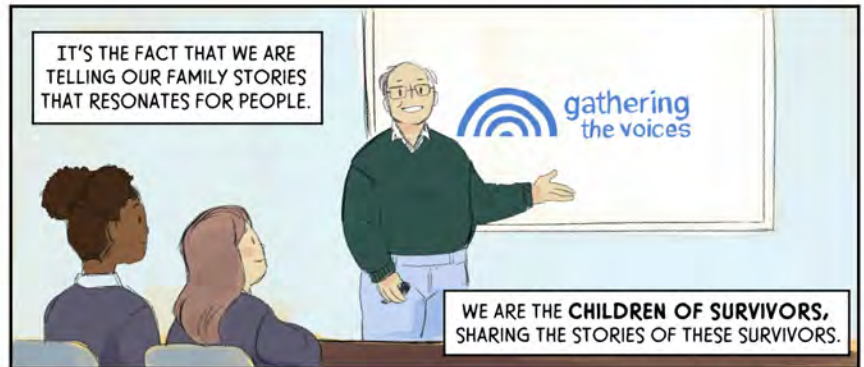

IT'S IMPORTANT FOR SURVIVORS' FAMILIES. IT'S SOMETIMES EASIER TO RECORD SOMEONE ELSE'S MOTHER OR FATHER THAN YOUR OWN. BUT EVERYONE'S GOT A STORY.

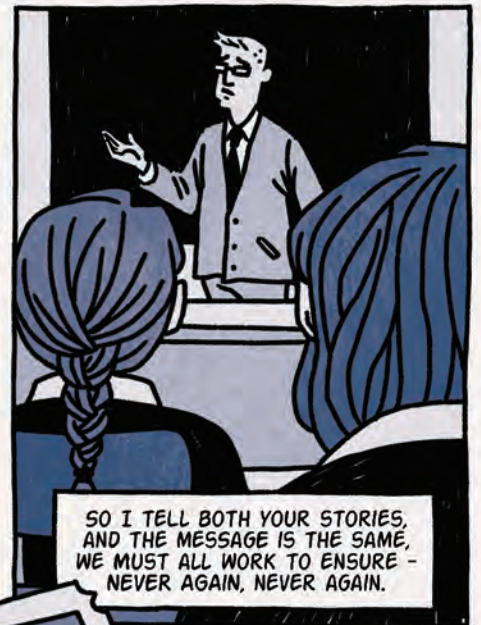

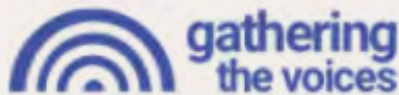
